[This volume, the first of two, establishes for the first time the life and career of F.W. Hasluck, the Librarian, Assistant Director, and sometime Acting Director of the British School at Athens. It offers at the same time a series of original essays by leading researchers on related themes: the Schools and Institutes abroad; personalities associated with them; and observations on the Bektashis, whom Hasluck studied extensively. A brilliant thinker, perhaps the finest that has ever worked at the British School, Hasluck's career was at the same time dogged by misfortune. Refused permission to live at the School after his marriage to Margaret Hardie, then sacked in 1916 at the request of Wace (an event that is falsified in the School's official history) he died in obscurity in Switzerland of consumption in 1920. Yet, his work was entirely modernist in nature, perhaps too much so for a disciplinary ethos that was still largely predicated upon the idea of survivals. In his introduction, Shankland argues that now, nearly a century later, the time has come to acknowledge Hasluck's wide-ranging and innovative contribution, and indeed, the events that shaped his life.]

The second volume of the set continues and builds on the first, looking at syncretism and conversion; travelers, empire and nation; and archaeology, heritage and ideology. This original set of essays is at once a series of elaborations on themes relating to Hasluck's works and represents at the same time the very best of contemporary, multidisciplinary international scholarship in the region. Underlying many of the essays here is the idea of separation and reconciliation: Whether indeed, looking at our own disciplinary practices, we need to continue with an ipso facto separation between archaeology and anthropology, and more widely, the consequences for human societies when cultures mix and come together, both in modern times and historic.]

The scribes of the Old Testament knew and included the Lydians in the table of the Nations. Their burial mounds which are spread on the flats of her Hermus near Sardis have been a sight of wonder for travelers since antiquity. The information supplied by ancient literature, much of which we owe to Herodotus and Xenophon and research in the first half of the last century, has been supplemented by what is being revealed by excavations in and around their capital .

What may be known about the Lydians by the general reader, however, may not amount to more than some stories such as that of the fabulous wealth of King Croesus which inspired tales of prosperity and gave birth to the expression 'rich as Croesus' or that the Lydians were the people who invented metal coinage. The objective of this book is to be present the history and culture of the Lydians as a whole without trying to give all of what is known about them. Despite its limited size, much of what the book comprises is not accessible to the general reader as a whole anywhere else.]
