Korean scholars believe that the history of Korean mask dance dramas dates back to the Neolithic era around 5000 B.C. This belief gains support from an ancient shell mask found in Busan, the southern city in South Korea. Mask performances have served as a central part in Korean's lives since that time. However, for several decades, there have been different theories as regarding the origins of Bonsandae-nori, which is considered as the arche-type of Korean mask dance dramas.
