The present Annotated sources of Ming History (ASMH) is a completely revised and substantially enlarged edition of Wolfgang Franke's 1968 edition of An Introduction to the Sources of Ming History (ISMH). As we all know the scholarship of ISMH has been well-acknowledged in the field of Chinese Studies worldwide. However, more than forty years after its publication, the ISMH has become obsolete as many of the original ming sources inaccessible to W. Franke at that time have been reproduced in facsimile or reprinted in typeset. Liew-Herres, in revising the ISMH, has added many works either overlooked by or inaccessible to W. Franke at that time. The ASMH provides annotations to almost 2500 salient texts pertaining to the history and society of the Ming Dynasty, in addition to two detailed introductions dealing with Ming historiography in general. The work is supplemented with tow indexes (author and book titles), a glossary index of special terms and official titles, and a bibliography of reference works cited. The ASMH aims at providing key descriptions of the sources, information on authors, the editions, references and original copies available. In 1603, Dutch Admiral Jakob van Heemskerk plundered a Portuguese merchantman, the Santa Catarina, travelling from Macao to Melaka. The sale of the cargo at a public auction made traders across Northern Europe aware of the riches to be reaped from Asian trade. However, the episode raised legal questions and the United Dutch East India Company (VOC) commissioned the young Hugo Grotius to defend Heemskerk's

actions. Grotius produced two classic legal texts, The Law of Prize and Booty and its spin-off, The Free Sea, among the greatest works in the history of international legal and political thought. Banditry was rife around Batavia (modern Jakarta) during the late colonial period. Banditry in West Java identifies the bandits and describes both their working methods and their motives, which often went beyond simple self-enrichment. The author also explores the world of the victims of the robbers, mainly city-dwellers, who viewed them as the antithesis of civilization and made them into convenient subjects onto which respectable citizens projected their own preoccupations with sex, violence, and magic. Banditry was brought under control following reforms to the colonial police force in the Dutch East Indies in the early 1920s, but the bandit tradition lived on in Javanese popular imagination and folk culture. In particular it is found in tales of Si Pitung, a Robin Hood figure who flourished in nineteenth-century Batavia.
