This exemplary work of international collaboration takes an integral approach to the histories of Northeast and Southeast Asia, with contributions from scholars familiar with Japanese, Chinese and Korean academic discourse as well as that of English. The new scholarship represented by this volume demonstrates that the vast and growing maritime interactions between the countries of eastern Asia have long historical roots. The so-called "opening" to Western trade in the mid-nineteenth century was not the beginning of this process, as often assumed, but rather the return to a dynamic earlier pattern which had been interrupted by a phase of defensive state consolidation in the long eighteenth century. Asia cannot be understood without its "offshore" oceanic interactions as well as the continental ones.

When the Bush War commenced he volunteered for the Police Anti-Terrorist Unit (PATU) in which he saw action in the fight against terrorists and became the first Police Reservist to be awarded the much prized Police Decoration for Gallantry. He bought his own light aircraft and was accepted into the Police Reserve Air Wing. He remained in PRAW until the end of the war conducting reconnaissance operations, casevacs, trooping and courier missions often under fire.

After the British supervised elections in 1980 which brought Mugabe to power, he turned his attention back to farming and carried out major developments building 20 tobacco curing barns, sheds, an aircraft hanger, staff houses, a farm store, 21 dams for irrigation and much more. The long history of Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital (its full current name) or Bara, as it's popularly known, has been shaped by a complex set of conditions. Established in the early 1940s, Bara stands on land purchased by the Cornish immigrant John Albert Baragwanath in the late nineteenth century. He set up a refreshment post, trading store and hotel on the site – in what is now Soweto – which was a one day journey by ox-wagon from Johannesburg. The hotel became affectionately known as 'Baragwanath Place' (the surname is Welsh, from 'bara' meaning 'bread' and 'gwenith' meaning 'wheat'). The land was then bought by Corner House Mining Group and later taken over by Crown Mines Ltd. but was never mined.

In Scotland he had been the founding editor of Blackwood's Magazine and a key Enlightenment figure, and later in England he was instrumental in bringing in the abolition of slavery.

Born on the Scottish Borders, Pringle entered literary life in late Enlightenment Edinburgh, but in 1820 led a party of settlers to the Cape Colony. After running a school, launching a literary journal and co-editing the Cape's first independent newspaper, he led a group to fight for the rights of the settlers, the oppressed indigenous people and the slaves. On returning to Britain he became Secretary of the Anti-Slavery Society, and on 15 June 1834 announced the implementation of abolition.
